

Need Assessment Department's Achievements

This department conducts **need-assessment surveys** and **field visits**, communicates and coordinates with local entities and organizations, and **collaborates with INGOs** to determine its programs and activities.

Idleb Governorate Need Assessment:


- 1. Ihsan conducted a comprehensive survey to determine needs in all sectors. The survey was designed in coordination with Omran Center for Strategic Studies to meet the methodological requirements. The survey was conducted in cooperation with SF Office in Idleb. 600 surveys were collected covering 474 villages, covering most of the geographical area of the Governorate. The department analyzed and evaluated the surveys and produced a comprehensive report that is being used as a reference for projects taking place in Idleb.
- 2. Ihsan joined the **Education Sector Assessment Joint-Agency** Syria level. Ihsan also joined the **Assessment and Monitoring Initiative SAMI**, which seeks to coordinate in the need-assessment field between foreign and Syrian organizations.





- Ihsan provided in-kind support valued at \$2,515,758 in food security, which is still
 ranked as the mostly needed inside Syria. Ihsan emphasized on finding alternative
 solutions to help areas under siege, and sponsored livelihood projects that fulfilled
 basic needs for vegetables, meat, and bread such as farming and animal breeding.
- Ihsan implemented five projects, including but not limited to the following:
 - 1. Breeding cows and rabbits in **besieged Jobar** on the outskirts of Damascus.
 - 2. Land cultivation project in **besieged al-Asali, south Damascus.**
 - 3. Planting wheat and vegetables in **400 hectares** and **1500 household** gardens in **Hama, Aleppo, and Idleb** by providing farmers with the **necessary seeds, fertilizers, and agricultural equipment,** in partnership with Global Communities.

- Ihsan also supported 12 projects that provide bread inside Syria in each of Idleb,
 Daraa, and Rural Damascus. Examples of these projects include the establishment
 of Al-Hayat Bakery in al-Ghadfe, Idleb Southern Suburb with 12,500 beneficiaries.
 Ihsan provided flour for the bakery in partnership with Human Appeal International for
 more than six consecutive months. The estimated total value of support was \$109,600.
- Ihsan distributed 22,234 food basket in each of Aleppo, Idleb, and Rural Damascus.
 It also distributed 16,500 food baskets (estimated value of \$80) provided by the UN
 WFP during a period of partial siege of Aleppo.
- Ihsan **sponsored 3,781 refugees** with a total estimated value of **\$378,111** residing in neighboring countries.









Ihsan provided \$349,950 for 11 schools to cover teachers' salaries and facility repairs. Over 13,000 students benefited from these grants, and 1,384 job opportunities secured for teachers and staff. Examples of schools that were provided grants:

- 1. Can (Jan) Syrian Association in Okmeydani, and Beyram-Tape, Turkey.
- 2. Afaq Primary School, Reyhanli, Turkey.
- 3. Killis refugee camp school, Turkey.
- 4. School of Syrians in Mersin, Turkey.
- 5. Two schools in Inkhil and Daraa, Syria.







Ihsan implemented several projects in the protection sector such as **women empowerment** projects and **livelihood support**. Ihsan also contributed to construction of an **orphanage** in Idleb and provided assistance worth **\$10,600**. Ihsan **sponsored orphans** in Hama Governorate, in addition to the related activities that provided shelter and comfort.

Ihsan spent a total of \$35,170 divided into two projects:

- 1. Sewing work center in Al-Hame, Damascus. This provided steady jobs for women in areas under siege to support their families and produce materials that are direly needed winter clothes for the community.
- 2. Mazaya Training Center in Idleb. This center provided training courses in the sewing skills and related cultural crafts. The center offers training courses in many fields such as foreign languages and computer skills. A library and forum has been established for women debates and inter-cultural dialogue in addition to Mazaya magazine that is also issued by the center.







Total support in health sector **\$614,627**:

- 1. Sponsored **medical professionals' compensation**.
- Supported 4 urgent care centers along the borders with Turkey and Jordan. These
 centers offered services to 1,500 patients with an estimated total cost of \$263,195.
- 3. Implemented the first project for medicine production used by populations under siege; 50 types of drugs were manufactured, covering the needs of 22 medical centers operating in besieged eastern Ghouta. This drug-manufacturing project provides regular income for 15 families with over 350,000 beneficiaries.






Economic Development



- Ihsan's investment in **micro credit projects** reached **\$26,350** and still ongoing.
- The dairy and cheese production projects carried out in Tafas, Daraa Suburb, and in Al-Meleiha, Rural Damascus, in addition to the sewing workshop in Deir Azzor are examples of grants provided in the economic development sector.







- Ihsan provided support valued at \$67,425 for digging and maintenance of wells and water pumping projects to secure drinking water for more than 200,000 beneficiaries in Aleppo, Deir Azzor, and Rural Damascus due to water cuts and/or the destruction in the water supply systems.
- Ihsan distributed hygiene and sanitation kits valued at \$21,400 in besieged areas
 to prevent the spread of diseases caused by waste and leaks in sewage systems.
- Ihsan distributed **26,650** health basket in Aleppo, Idleb, al-Raqqah, and Lattakia.







Ihsan implemented numerous projects within this sector such as:

- Established a **guest house** for people with no shelter that are coming for short periods to receive medical treatment in **Turkey.**
- Distributed **1,800 blankets** in **Banyas, Deir Azzor,** and some cities along Turkish borders.
- Distributed 2,224 winter basket in Sinjar, Idleb.
- Distributed **2,252 basket** of household items and mattresses in **Aleppo, Idleb, and Lattakia**.
- Distributed 1,500 basket in Lattakia in partnership with GOAL.







Ihsan supported **electricity projects** and **buildings rehabilitation**. By implementing two electricity network rehabilitation in **Daraa**, Ihsan secured electricity for **285,000 people** and secured the needed **energy** to run the **bakeries** that serve the residents of the area and the internally **displaced**.





Ihsan supported **local councils** and **civil society organizations** through direct grants to cover **administrative expenses** or sponsoring events, activities and trainings. The total value of these grants was **\$1,334,460**. **Examples** of entities that received grants:










Total Number of Beneficiaries

- Ihsan received **direct grants** from the **UN** through Humanitarian Pooled Fund Program.
- **SF funded 47%** of the total projects budget for Ihsan.
- SF engages in capacity building of local councils and civil society organizations.

- Ihsan joined Syria Assessment and Monitoring Initiative SAMI that coordinates between INGOs and UN organizations.
- Ihsan is a member of the **Syrian NGO Alliance** and one of its founders. SNA seeks to coordinate between Syrian humanitarian NGOs and the international community.










Visitor Ratio During the Last 4 Months of 2014















Cease Fire Agreements Poll

- Omran published a first study of its kind in this regard entitled "Cease Fire Agreements (CFA) in Syria: Reality and Horizons", issued on 25 February 2014. The increasing number of cease fire agreements that were reached in Rural Damascus, prompted Omran to undertake a more in-depth analytical study on CFA's based on a field survey. The poll was conducted in coordination with the Syrian Center for Research and Statistics and collected from 1,026 randomly selected individuals over 5 weeks during July and August 2014. The survey questions focused on three main tracks to analyze CFA's from a political, economic, social, and legal aspects.
- Omran published **three analytical studies** on the results of the poll concluding that CFA's **do not present a sustainable and comprehensive solution** to the crisis, but rather a **"band aid"** temporary last resort for residents.





Cultural and Social Activities

- **18 studies** and articles were published in **8 local newspapers** and websites. The content focused on inter-cultural dialogue among Syrians highlighting common cultural grounds among **Arabs, Kurds and Turkmen Syrians**.
- "Arab and Kurd on the Paths of Suffering and Dialogue" study addressed how
 divisions were created historically between Syrian Arabs and Kurds. It also discussed
 the concept of appropriate peaceful cultural environment for better understanding of
 each other to establish a vibrant civil society.
- "The Kurds Mountain Revolution" was a study that presented a historical approach between the current Syrian revolution and the Syrian revolution against occupiers in the Kurds Mountain in Syria.
- Papers were disseminated to explore Kurdish and Turkmen cultures with special focus on prose, poetry, journalism, and history.

Cultural and Social Track - Activities

- Arab, Kurd, Turkmen Cultural Forum: held in Gaziantep on 3 June 2014 where a number of Arab, Kurd, and Turkmen intellectuals, writers and poets attended. Papers addressed different cultures in Syria and the common grounds between them.
- Arab, Kurd, Turkmen Literature Summit: held on 6 January 2014 at the lounge of Ali Amiri in the Turkish Cultural Center in Istanbul. Literary texts were presented by Arab, Kurd, and Turk poets and writers, in addition to other variety of artistic expressions.





Arts and Theater

- A number of plays were used to deliver the concept of **cultural dialogue**. Scripts were carefully selected to leave a **positive intellectual** and **educational impact** on the audience.
- Atyaf Theater Company was founded in June 2014 in Batman, Turkey with SF's support and the help of the Fener team. The cast consisted of a writer, a director, and 6 actors.
- The first production of the company was "Invincible Field", which was a children play in Medyat Refugee Camp, south-east Turkey. The play was well received by both children and families.
- The company performed another show in the cultural center of Batman then in the Syrian school in Medyat.
- The company seeks to perform its shows in all Syrian refugee camps and areas with high Syrian populations in Turkey to promote values of coexistence and social understanding.

School Activities

- Fener team visited **Syrian schools in Istanbul** to initiate continuous cooperation between them in order to spread the concept of **cultural dialogue** among the young generation to strengthen **national unity** among a diverse **Syrian society.** Many public **awareness activities** were conducted along with meetings with educational and administrative staff to emphasize the importance of cultural unity in diversity and spread a **compassionate atmosphere** among students.
- Seminars held with educational institutions include:
 - 1. Intellectual Diversity in Schools
 - 2. How to Be an Effective Teacher



Public Lectures

- Conducted periodic lectures and workshops for the Syrian community in Turkey.
- Organized lectures in coordination with other **Syrian entities** including:
 - Students Forum Seminar
 - Critical Thinking
 - Social Engineering
 - Human Rights in Islam
 - Countering Extremism Among the Youth

The Syrian Guide

- A general guide covering basic needs of Syrians in Turkey including:
 - 1. Information on legal and governmental procedures.
 - 2. List of **public** and **private hospitals** and special services for Syrians.
 - 3. Lists of **primary schools, universities** and other **educational institutions** including information on **registration** and **scholarships**.
 - 4. Information on **job recruitment.**
 - 5. Organizations that focus on **serving** the **needs of Syrians.**
 - 6. Contact information of important **Turkish institutions**.
- The Guide is updated regularly from official sources.

Sports Track - Njoom al-Ghad Academy

- Began in June 2014 in Turkey.
- Leading the "sports activities" track in Fener for Community Advancement.
- Formed the **first soccer team** with 25 players between the **ages 6-13.**
- Organized matches with Beşiktaş Turkish Academy, resulting in recruitment of Syrian players into Turkish leagues.
